OBJECTIVE 1

SLIDES	Students will define critical and noncritical observations.
1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • State objective
2	<p>Ask the class, in your own words, how would you define a critical observation?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An observation that could help prevent an injury or can help to correct or prevent a procedural or tech spec violation.
3	<p>Ask the class, in your own words, how would you define a noncritical observation?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An observation that has little to no value in correcting an issue or preventing an injury.
4	<p>Pose the question: Why are we here what is our purpose as an organization at BFN?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Our ultimate job is to protect the people of the Tennessee Valley that live in this area. • Our job is to protect the workers while they are in our plant working. Whether that is from radiological hazards or industrial hazards. • Protecting the plant will in turn allow us to focus on the other two. If the plant is in good shape, then the people of the Valley are safe, and we can focus on keeping each other safe.
5	<p>Define Critical Observations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Critical Observation: To notice indispensable or vital details, exercising or involving careful judgment or judicious evaluation.
6	<p>Define Noncritical Observations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Noncritical Observation: To not notice indispensable or vital details, not exercising or involving careful judgment or judicious evaluation.
7	<p>Give critical observation examples and facilitate discussion about other examples of critical observations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Posting missing or not installed properly • Step-off Pad not installed or installed backwards • Items crossing boundaries without being secured
8	<p>Give noncritical observation examples and facilitate discussion about other examples of critical observations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Paper in the floor • Spiderwebs in the overhead • Boundaries not straight enough • Workers standing around talking

9&10	<p>Ask students how many examples of Critical Observations they can find on the slide?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Grating not secure, hoses in the floor, extension cords not properly tied off..... <p>If none of the students give an example of a noncritical observation, then ask about the two security guards who are just standing in the plant talking.</p>

Critical Observation Definition

To notice indispensable or vital details, exercising or involving careful judgment or judicious evaluation.

Noncritical Observation Definition

To **not** notice indispensable or vital details, **not** exercising or involving careful judgment or judicious evaluation.

Critical Observation Examples

- Posting missing or not installed properly
- Step-off Pad not installed or installed backwards
- Items crossing boundaries without being secured
- Anything else.....

Noncritical Observation Examples

- Paper in the floor
- Spiderwebs in the overhead
- Boundaries not straight enough
- Workers standing around talking
- Anything else.....
